



Release from liability for self administered medication/procedures

Under the direction of a physician and with the physician's and parent's authorization, certain students may be permitted to carry and inhaler for asthmatic conditions (H.B. 1688) or Blood Sugar Testing Kits. Only students/families who have complied with the following guidelines will be allowed to carry the medication/medical supplies:

1. All medications/supplies must be labeled by the pharmacy or a physician.
2. The parents will present a written statement from the student's physician or other licensed health care provider, signed by the physician or provider, that states:
  - a. that the student has asthma and is capable of self administering the prescription asthma medicine
  - b. the name and purpose of the medicine
  - c. the prescribed dosage for the medicine
  - d. the times at which or circumstances under which the medicine may be administered
  - e. the period for which the medicine is prescribed
3. The nurse's office will notify the teachers that the student is self administering medication. The student will notify the teacher of the need for medication prior to using the device in class.
4. The medication/procedure will be administered in an area away from the other students.
5. The students are responsible for all medicines and medical supplies. They are to stay in their possession the entire time that they are at school or at a school sponsored activity.
6. Any abuse of medicine (i.e., sharing an inhaler with another student) will result in the immediate suspension of this agreement. All reported incidents of possible abuse will be investigated and if applicable, referral to the appropriate authorities will be made.
7. The parent assumes all responsibility and liability for their students.
